We saw many Hawaiian rituals...




... and even some unexpected action!

We had a nice ocean view room.













And there was plenty of wildlife on the grounds.



Well, it wasn't really that wild.




The sunsets on Maui are the best.




Every night is a unique surprise.




And they seem to get better every night.

And every view seemed exotic.




There was great scenery everywhere...



... and many good photo opportunities...






...even involving your own family.

...but she recovered just in time for an early birthday treat.


